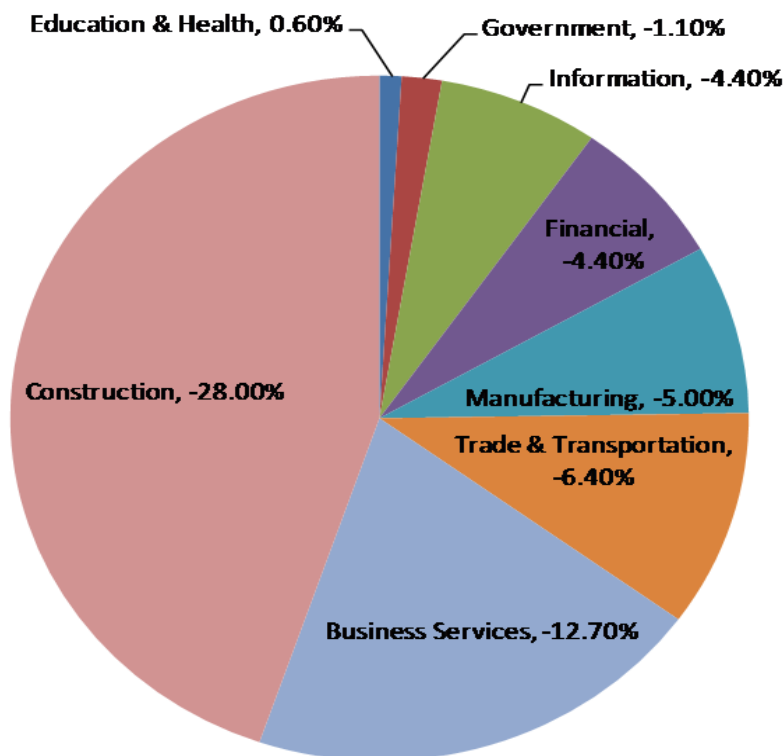

ARRA Summer Youth Employment Program — The Summer Youth Employment Program is underway. During the month of June more than **3,200 youth** will be receiving Work Readiness training. This is their first step in preparing for their Summer Work Experience. *Work Readiness Training consists training sessions covering: completing applications, building a resume, interviewing skills and career decision making.*

Workforce Connections staff and Youth Providers are working diligently to match youth participant skills and schedules with the opportunities presented by the **1,226 employment positions** sought by local employers.

PARTNER ITEMS

Maricopa Community College District Zeros in on Stimulus Funding — MCCCDCenter for Workforce Development (CWD) staff has been meeting with college representatives and regional partners to coordinate efforts in attracting Workforce Investment Act (WIA) competitive training dollars from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Over \$15 million has been approved for Maricopa County/City of Phoenix to provide adult, youth, dislocated worker, and rapid response workforce training. The CWD is working with MWC and PWC to identify top job demand areas and as the economy begins to recover. This information will help drive WIA supported cohort training that will be made available beginning in August/September, for short terms (6-18 months), credit or non-credit, offered in program areas already available at MCCCDC. Areas being considered include:

- Automotive Repair
- Green/Sustainability
- Health Care
- Information Technology
- Manufacturing

In addition CWD is working with its colleges and partners to lure additional competitive and youth services WIA dollars and is exploring scholarship opportunities for its students.
